A letter from Mrs E. J. Barton, District President was read, answering our inquiry as to just what the Endowment Fund is used for. It is a State Federation plan to help finance State expenses, to help meet the cost of a Year Book, State Bulletin (Such as Golden Idols) and the expenses of the State President in going to and from State meetings. When the sum total of \$10,000 is reached the interest on which would take care of such expenses.

Mrs Mateer reported to date a 1000 volumes in our library, \$18.21 cash in bank, \$16.61 credit at Mr. Churex and \$6.25 on hand in fine money.

Two new cases for books were made by the Manual Training boys of the High School, and were put to use immediately. One case was made from the doors taken off the old cases which were not needed there.

Mrs H. J. Davidow reported the \$100.00 quota for Girl Reserve work collected within \$10.00. Later this being paid in and a warrant for the full amount \$100.00 was drawn on the treasury.

Mr. John Hedger made the club an offer if we would consider it, to sell tickets to the picture shows. He would give us as our share, one half the amount of the tickets we sold. After the present ten weeks contract had expired, we would also have the privilege of choosing the pictures we wanted shown.

It was decided to leave this proposition to the Building Committee. It was voted upon and carried.

This was the day for the library dollars to be turned in. Each member present responded. There were many interesting and clever poems read telling how the various dollars were earned.

\$28.55 was taken in from this source to be turned over to the library.
