Regarding resolutions to be presented at the State Convention, it was moved to table the matter until the next meeting.


The General Federation Magazine has been sent to the President. The subscription fee is \$1.00 per year if you care to subscribe.

Nominating Committee reported that they had two candidates for President. They were Mrs. Scrivner and Mrs. Marsters. Mrs. Marsters was elected.



Program: Mrs. Hedges reported that Mrs. Clark did the printing of the programs.


