ATTENTION MOBILE HOME OWNERS & DEALERS

There has been considerable confusion in the past as to the laws and ordinances governing mobile homes. The purpose of this letter is to explain these laws. Please read it thoroughly and familiarize yourself with its contents.

ASSESSMENT NOTICES: ADA COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 45

All mobile homes within Ada County are required to display a current assessment sticker provided by the county. Penalty for failure to display this sticker is a fine or imprisonment or both.

MOVING A MOBILE HOME: IDAHO CODES NO. 63-1310 & 49-155

Before any mobile home is moved out of or within the county, it must be licensed and the taxes must be paid.

SELLING OR TRADING A MOBILE HOME: IDAHO CODE NO. 63-1310

All taxes must be paid at time of a sale, repossession or trade of any mobile home. If unpaid, the tax remains against the mobile home or any other personal property of the owner and will be turned over to the sheriff for collection. Obviously, all tax matters must be resolved before the sale is closed.

PARTIAL ASSESSMENTS: IDAHO CODES 63-105S, 63-1206

Mobile homes sold during the year by a private party will be taxed for a full year at the time of the sale.

Mobile homes in dealer inventories sold after January 1 will be assessed on a pro-rated basis for the year, with the taxes due being deferred until normal collection period. A statement of tax liability must be obtained from the Ada County Treasures office in order to transfer title and legally move the mobile home.
